TO JOIN THE MEETING VIA COMPUTER - Go to https://zoom.us/join and put in the Meeting ID: 987 6658 0221.

TO JOIN THE MEETING BY TELEPHONE:

Every person wishing to address the Neighborhood Council must DIAL 1 669 900 6833, then dial Meeting ID: 987 6658 0221, and then press # to join the meeting. Instructions on how to sign up for public comment will be given to listeners at the start of the meeting. If you wish to Raise your Hand to address the board, press *9 and the moderators will ask you to speak. You will be identified by the last 4 digits of your phone number.

TO JOIN THE MEETING VIA SMARTPHONE APP (ZOOM):

Instructions to join this meeting via a Smartphone app (recommended): You must download the **Zoom app** on your smartphone (iPhone and Android) to participate.

 How to download the Zoom app (FREE) on an iPhone and join a meeting: Click on the App store icon on your iPhone -> on the lower right-hand corner click on the Search button -> type the phrase Zoom on the search bar and press search -> Identify ZOOM Cloud Meetings from the search results -> Click on GET icon located next to the ZOOM Cloud Meetings app. You might be prompted to type your Apple app store password. Type your password to download the Zoom app. After downloading the Zoom app, locate the Zoom app on your smartphone and click on it to open. From the Zoom app click on Join a Meeting -> type the Zoom Meeting ID 987 6658 0221 to join the meeting. [You might also be asked to provide an email address. Please provide your email address and click join.] During the Conference, finger-Tap on your iPhone screen to show the menu option during the conference. There you can see a button labeled Raise Hand. Click on Raise Hand to address the Board. You will be called on in turn. Please make sure your microphone is unmuted when you begin to speak.

Presenters' Biographies



ANDREW C. KENDALL

LADWP, Senior Assistant General Manager - Power System Construction, Maintenance, and Operations

Andrew Kendall is a 37-year veteran of the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP). In his role as Executive Director of Power System Construction, Maintenance, and Operations, Mr. Kendall reports directly to the General Manager. He has oversight of Power Transmission and Distribution, Power Construction and Maintenance, Power Supply Operations, and the Power System Safety and Training Group. Specifically, his attention will be directed to the construction efforts and infrastructure improvements that are necessary to support an even more reliable and robust power system.

Having promoted several times through the lineman series, Mr. Kendall is well prepped for this leadership role. He has coordinated the work of multiple crews engaged in the construction, maintenance, and emergency repair of the Power System, successfully meeting or beating deadlines while keeping a close eye on employee and public safety. His previously held posts include Electric Distribution Mechanic Supervisor, Transmission and Distribution District Supervisor, and Electrical Service Manager.

In November of 2012, Mr. Kendall led a team of over 60 employees who were deployed to New York to help rebuild the area's electrical system that was damaged by Hurricane Sandy.

Mr. Kendall earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Management from the University of Phoenix.



KEITH MALONE

Keith Malone brings more than 30 years of public relations and public affairs experience to the California Fuel Cell Partnership, a public-private partnership working to bring zero-emission, hydrogen-powered vehicles to the California road. In addition to communications, he leads education and outreach efforts to state legislators and staff, and represents CaFCP with the press and at events.

Prior to joining CaFCP, Keith helped multi-cultural nonprofit organizations, elected officials and political candidates communicate and build relationships with their stakeholders. A third-generation Angeleno, Keith received his bachelor of

arts degree from Occidental College and his master of arts from USC's Annenberg School for Communication.



ANDRES RAMIREZ

Andres Ramirez is Policy Director for Pacoima Beautiful. He has over 15 years experience with organizing and policy advocacy with an equity focus on environmental justice, transportation, land use, education, and racial justice. He currently serves on several public advisory groups including Metro's Policy Advisory Council, CPUC/CEC Disadvantaged Communities Advisory Group, and the SOMAH Advisory Council.



ASHER SIEBERT

Asher Siebert, a senior staff associate at Columbia University's International Research Institute for Climate and Society (IRI - iri.columbia.edu), has a PhD in Geography from Rutgers University (2015), a Master's degree in Climate and Society from Columbia University and a Bachelor's degree in Geosciences from Princeton University. In the 2000s, he worked with scientists from NASA to inform the NYC DEP on climate change risks for New York City and worked on the development of drought insurance pilot projects in the UN Millennium Villages

project in Africa. Asher's dissertation research explored the viability of climate index insurance in the context of the West African Sahel and during a postdoctoral position at Princeton in 2015-16, he collaborated with an interdisciplinary team to model the potential climatic and socioeconomic implications of different carbon tax scenarios.

In his role at IRI over the last 5 years, Asher's work has been supported by a number of international development and scientific agencies and has primarily engaged with seasonal and sub-seasonal climate forecasting for agricultural decision support and forecast-based financing in a number of countries in Africa (Rwanda, Ethiopia, Tanzania, Malawi, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Senegal and Niger). He has trained and advised African meteorological staff, has authored or coauthored several dozen journal articles and conference proceedings, and is also interested in projections and characteristics of climatic extreme events, climatic impacts on health and climatic impacts on the energy sector. Asher lives in New York's Hudson Valley with his wife and daughter and enjoys music, hiking and a range of sports and recently applied for a grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to study the predictability of heat waves in California.



JARED SILVIA

Jared Silvia is currently CEO and President of BlueDot Photonics, a Seattle-based company working to commercialize next-generation solar technologies. He is responsible for overall operations and business development activities for BlueDot. Jared joined BlueDot after working in the cleantech sector for Doosan GridTech. While at Doosan, Jared oversaw overall business and product strategy development and helped the newly formed company commercialize solutions for integrating distributed energy resources into the electric grid. Prior to Doosan, Jared worked at McKinsey and Co. where he served companies in the energy and materials sectors on strategy and operation topics. Jared has a PhD in Chemistry from MIT ('11) where his thesis focused on carbon dioxide conversion schemes. Jared

also earned an MPhil in Chemistry from the University of Cambridge as a Churchill Scholar. A long-time resident of Washington, Jared is a graduate of the University of Washington where he earned a BS in Chemistry and a BS in Biochemistry.
